INCPAS Programs

• **INCPAS Scholars**. A career awareness and mentoring program for underrepresented high school students. Sponsoring organizations provide mentors for the scholars.

Through a wide array of monthly career and collegeprep events, Indiana students not only gain important skills for their future, but also establish long-lasting relationships with some of the most respected CPAs in Indiana. Currently, Scholars programs are held in both Central Indiana and South Bend.

• Alumni Ambassadors. A group of five former INCPAS Scholars who are accounting majors at Indiana colleges/universities.

These student leaders write blogs and articles for the Society, plan and promote CPA profession events and help the Society communicate with Scholar alumni and accounting students on campus. Alumni Ambassadors also plan the Alumni Workshop.

• Alumni Workshop & Reception. Held annually in August, this event gathers former Scholars in Indianapolis for an exciting day full of profession related workshops.

Students hear from CPAs, recruiters and others to get energized for the coming school year. The reception recognizes graduating Scholars, their mentors and the sponsors. Scholars receive their academic gift for successfully completing the program.

• Game On: CPAs in Action. Hosted annually in Indianapolis, Fort Wayne, Hammond and South Bend, this half-day career awareness event exposes high school students to the CPA profession though interactive sessions and office/campus tours.

INCPAS members from each community work together to promote the CPA profession and share what accounting is all about.

• **Diversity Network.** A new network for Scholar alumni and diversity & inclusion stakeholders that provides educational, networking and service opportunities for a diverse group of CPAs and CPA candidates. The group will meet six times a year.

Who Makes a Good Mentor?

INCPAS Scholars mentors are highly passionate CPAs and CPA candidates. In general, they are at the beginning of their career and can offer advice on everything from what it takes to be successful in college to navigating the CPA profession. INCPAS Scholars mentors can hold a conversation, are great listeners and are able to commit to the program for the year. It's essential that mentors are up to the challenge and passionate about their role as a mentor.

Mentor Responsibilities

We understand work and life makes CPAs busy, and we try to keep that in mind as we progress through the Scholars program. In general, we ask mentors to:

- Send at least one email and two text messages to their Scholar per month.
- Have a conversation over the phone at least once per month.
- Meet their Scholar for lunch or coffee at least once per semester.
- Attend at least three INCPAS Scholars events.
- Give a presentation at their Scholar's school about the INCPAS Scholars program and the CPA profession. Their Scholar assists in this presentation.
- Coordinate a summer job shadow day.

Since this is an Indiana CPA Society program, Society membership is a requirement of all mentors. If the selected mentor is not an active INCPAS member, he/she will be invoiced at the first-time member rate of \$150 prior to the welcome dinner.

"It's important for those in the profession to give back. It's not a huge time commitment, but you need to focus on it and make it a priority.

Prioritizing the Scholar builds trust and the relationship grows. It's important to be authentic and vulnerable because then the student trusts you and will open up.

Sometimes we take for granted what we as CPA professionals have been through and we don't realize how much help we can give to students. You've been through the college journey and all of these high school students want to pursue college goals. They want to be able to talk to somebody about the process and you can help.

We will definitely continue our relationship, especially as he starts the application process for both colleges and scholarships. He knows to reach out to me, I reach out to him, and we definitely plan to stay in touch."
