During CPA Week, CPAs come together to engage with Indiana high school students, offering them a unique glimpse into the exciting world of accounting.

Volunteers share insights on what makes their careers truly fulfilling. They provide invaluable insights into the wide array of opportunities in the profession, debunk common myths, and share resources for students to learn more.

Since its inception in November 2020, INCPAS volunteers have impacted 7,328 students through 329 presentations. As we move forward, we eagerly anticipate expanding our reach and touching the lives of even more students during the upcoming fall CPA Week.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1 Is there anything I should do to prepare my class(es) for the CPA week presentations?

Prep work is not required. The presentation will cover accounting basics. Simply encouraging your students to actively participate and ask questions would be helpful.

2 My school participated in CPA Week previously, is the presentation the same?

It's similar content, but freshened up. This is a newly designed presentation. If students were present during the Fall 2023 or May 2024 CPA Week presentations, this would be a slightly new experience for them.

3 What does the presentation cover?

This presentation, *Accounting: What it is, isn't and why it's way more than math*, is just what the title suggests. Starting on page 10, you'll get a detailed overview of the presentation. Highlights include: what accounting is, myths and realities of accounting, examples of accounting jobs and resources for students to learn more about accounting.

How was my presenter selected and did they participate in a volunteer training?

Many of our CPA Week volunteers work for our Pipeline Partner organizations. These organizations have contributed financially and encourage their teams to volunteer. Other volunteers were selected by INCPAS or volunteered as CPAs who live in your community.

All volunteers are provided with a CPA Week Volunteer Guide and are strongly encouraged to watch the Volunteer Training.

Are there materials I need to distribute?

6 Will the presentation resonate with my students?

Yes, we hope! When creating this new presentation, the Society used the Center for Audit Quality's (CAQ) research on the influences and expectations of high school students. We incorporated many of the identified interests into the presentation.

Where can I learn more about the CAOS accounting pipeline research?

The CAQ launched the Accounting+ initiative as part of its Bold Ambition. Accounting+ recognizes the gap in African American, Black, and Hispanic accounting students and professionals. Accounting+ serves as a resource to educate, encourage, and facilitate the adoption of accounting as a career path.

The CAQs report, *Increasing Diversity in the Accounting Profession Pipeline: Challenges and Opportunities*, offers incredible insights into the interests, influences and expectations of students.












THE DETAILS

CPA Week presentations require a lot of coordination. We are keenly aware of the demands on you and your student's time and hope to make this a rewarding and informative experience. INCPAS coordinates the presentations, identifies the speakers, and develops the presentation and materials. As an educator, we want to make this as easy as possible for you!



WHAT TO EXPECT

Invite / Request

Depending on how you learned about CPA Week, you would have received an invitation to register or requested a presentation. INCPAS staff then works with you to coordinate a date/time that works.

Materials Email

Two weeks before the start of CPA Week, educators will receive an email with this guide! It will also include presentation details, an overview of the presentation & and a link to the slides.

Introduction Email

A week before your presentation, you will receive an email that includes your speaker(s). This email is an introduction and an opportunity for you to give any final instructions to the speakers (please provide check-in details & parking instructions).



PRESENTATION PREPARATION

As you prepare for your CPA Week presentation, you'll want to review the various to-do's. You can also access the CPA Week materials and presentation. Following these instructions will ensure the presentation goes smoothly.

ADVANCE TO-DO'S

Review the CPA Week Educator Guide

If you made it this far, you are actively completing this step. Great job! This guide will give you a lot of information about your upcoming presentation.

Read all CPA Week Emails

Carefully read each CPA Week email to ensure all details are correct. It's critical you pay attention to the start and end times of your scheduled presentations.

DAY OF TO-DO'S

Alert the Front Office

Be sure you tell your Front Office that you're having a guest speaker and give them the speaker's name and any instructions for finding your classroom.

Project the Presentation

Visit the presentation webpage and put the presentation on your classroom screen.

Distribute Materials

Distribute the provided materials to your students at the start of the CPA Week presentation.

PRESENTATION OVERVIEW

Before we dive into the presentation, it's important that you understand our goals with CPA Week and the strategy we're taking when discussing career opportunities with high school students.

The focus of this CPA Week presentation is on accounting itself, rather than the CPA license. Our primary goal is to **expose students to the vast array of opportunities that accounting offers**, dispelling any misconceptions that may shroud it. And, we want to do this in a way that resonates with the audience: high school students.


While CPA Week is one of the many steps the Society is taking to help build the CPA talent pipeline, talking about the intricate details of the CPA profession (the education, the Exam, the experience, the license) is too much information and not necessary at this point. Rather, we want to focus on accounting as a profession of opportunity and stick with the basics.

Throughout the presentation, your speaker will explore the multifaceted nature of work that accountants engage in, showcasing the diverse career paths that accountants have. The presentation begins by answering the question: "What is accounting?"

Next, they'll walk through accounting myths that are *quickly* followed with the realities of accounting. Then they will move on to several examples of accounting career paths.

Later in the presentation, students will learn about the benefits of the Indiana CPA Society's free student membership, emphasizing the wealth of resources it provides for those eager to embark on their accounting journey.

In addition, your speaker will share the support and guidance available from our partners at Accounting+, ALPFA, and NABA. These organizations are dedicated to nurturing future accounting professionals, and we share the opportunities they offer to students.

WHAT IS ACCOUNTING?


Accounting is the language of business. Accountants know how businesses works, how they function and how they present themselves to the world... through their financial statements.
















POSSIBLE CAREER PATHS

INCPAS SCHOLARS

This free, year-long program helps high school students learn about accounting and the CPA profession.

Currently this program is only run in the Indianapolis-area. CPA Week presentations at schools in this area will receive a supply of INCPAS Scholars brochures to distribute to students.



PROGRAM PERKS

Mentors. Students are matched with mentors to help guide and answer their questions about school, college and a career as a CPA.

College Night. University and financial aid reps host this Q&A event that families are also welcome to attend.

Campus Tours. Students take day trips to IU and Purdue University.

Corporate Visits. Students go behind-the-scenes with finance leaders at prestigious Indiana firms and companies to find out what it's like to work in their organizations.

\$500 & Recommendation Letter.

Students receive a\$500 academic gift and a letter of recommendation upon completion of the program.

CASE STUDIES

A great way to help your students see that they have the skills needed to be an accountant is to give them a case study and have them work individually or in groups to solve the problem.


These case studies were developed by Jill Richardson and were reproduced by Start Here, Go Places. Both teacher and student versions are available for download.

DOWNLOAD

Forensic Accounting Case Study: This case will introduce students to the world of forensic accounting as they are asked to assist in a potential criminal investigation. Students will identify red flags and follow the financial clues to determine if fraud was committed.

CPAs in Sports Case Study: This case will have your students act as the director of finance for a Major League Baseball team. In teams or individually, students will look for additional ways to increase revenue.

Staff Auditor for Public Accounting Firm Case Study: This case places students as auditors for a public accounting firm. They will recognize red flags at their client and offer suggestions for improved internal controls.








ALPFA
