FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1 What is the expected time commitment?
 - Mentors are invited to participate in all monthly events. However, you are not required to attend all events. Required events include the welcome dinner and one additional event. In addition to the monthly events, you should plan to have monthly conversations with your Scholar.
- When are the INCPAS Scholars events?

 Please see the INCPAS Scholars calendar for specific dates and times.

 This will not include mentoring session dates, as these will be determined by your Scholar, their family and you.
- If my Scholar needs a ride to an event, can I drive them?

 No! For liability reasons, under no circumstance can you drive your INCPAS Scholar to/from an event. Your Scholar should call Ali Tonini to help arrange alternate transportation.
- Will there be out of pocket costs?

 No. The INCPAS Scholars program is funded by our sponsoring partners. However, if you have a mentoring session at a restaurant/coffee shop, you may want to consider covering the expense.
- Of course! Just make sure you're talking to your Scholar each month!

 Many mentors Facetime with their Scholars while on trips. This is exciting for the Scholars to see the travel benefits of CPAs.



6 What should I talk with my Scholar about?

Refer to the calendar of events and discussion guides. You'll find important event details, an overview of the event and a discussion guide to aid in your conversation with your Scholar. Each month you will receive an email (and text if you opt in) providing details for the event.

7 I am having trouble connecting with my Scholar, what should I do?

The first month or two of the program can be challenging if you are paired with a Scholar who is shy or quiet. However, stick with it. Use the event discussion guides and review the Scholar communication tips.

Many of the Scholars will be taking a business/accounting class at school. Offering to help with homework or school projects is a great way to connect with your Scholar.

My Scholar is not responding to my texts, calls or emails.

What should I do?

INCPAS needs to know **right away**. Scholars are expected to be in touch with you every month and if they miss a meeting or phone call, we need to know this. Often, when a mentor is having trouble reaching their Scholar they simply got a new phone number.

9 Should I follow my Scholar on social media and is it appropriate to let them follow me?

This is entirely up to you. Some mentors have found this as an effective way to communicate with their Scholar and keep track of how they are doing. Consider setting up a privacy setting for the Scholar if there are photos that you would not want them to see.

Who is the INCPAS Scholars transportation provider?

Carey International will transport the students to INCPAS Scholars events. You are welcome to ride on the bus or meet us at our event locations.

What is the suggested attire for the events?

Before each event, look at your calendar of events for guidance on suggested attire. The dress will range from casual to business casual. On business casual days, it's a good idea to give your Scholar examples of what they could wear.

I don't think I'll be available for a presentation during CPA Week, what should I do?

This is understandable. Occasionally, a mentor is traveling and is not available or the thought of giving a presentation is stressful. This is okay. We work directly with the school to schedule presentations and will find another CPA to volunteer.

How is the INCPAS Scholars program funded?

The sponsoring firms, companies, colleges and universities have made a significant investment in the Society's pipeline and DEI initiatives. Mentoring is one part of that commitment. As a mentor you will have a profound impact on the college and career decisions of your Scholar!

Did you know?!



Commitment Matters: We realize work and life can get hectic, but it's critical you commit to this experience and communicate with your Scholar each month.

Discussion Guides: As you prepare to talk with your Scholar each month, review the Calendar of Events and Discussion Guides. These guides will provide suggested talking points for your monthly conversation. You are not required to cover each point, but try and help them prepare for our next event.

Stay in the Loop: Read the emails for event details, including RSVP links, event locations and suggested attire. Mentors can opt-in for text reminders.

Attendance Counts: Help your Scholar meet their attendance goal. They are required to attend 80% of scheduled events to earn a \$500 academic gift at the end of the program.

INCPAS Scholars have the unique opportunity to get an up-close, real world, glimpse at the CPA profession! A significant investment has been made to support our Scholars in this program and upon successful completion of the program, they will earn an academic gift of \$500.

The INCPAS Scholars Program requires a yearlong commitment. Each month, Scholars will be expected to attend and actively participate in various events. While it's understandable that a Scholar might need to skip an event or two, they must attend at least 80 percent of the events. Mentors are invited to attend all events, however attendance at two events in mandatory.



Attend at least 2 of the scheduled INCPAS Scholars events.

Send at least one e-mail & two texts to your Scholar each month.

Respond to your Scholar's emails, phone calls and texts.

Have a conversation with your Scholar at least once a month.

Meet with your Scholar for coffee/lunch at least once each semester.

Be a member of the Indiana CPA Society

Let INCPAS Staff know if you are having a difficult time connecting with your Scholar.

Have fun and know that you are making a difference!



COMMUNICATION

Communication is essential to the success of this program! The Society will communicate with Scholars and mentors through email, texts, phone calls and via social media. As a mentor, **you need to initiate conversation with your Scholar each month**. If you have trouble getting in contact with your Scholar tell Society staff immediately. Do not wait for a few weeks/months to inform Society staff. Do not worry about "getting your Scholars in trouble."



WAYS TO COMMUNICATE

Texting

Each month Scholars will receive a text with event details (date, time, location, etc.). They will also be able to RSVP for events via text message. Mentors can opt-in for text reminders.

E-mail

Prior to our events, you will receive a detailed email with a summary of the monthly event. You will also be able to RSVP for events via these emails.

YOUR SCHOLAR

As a mentor, you are an invaluable resource for your Scholar. Your role is pivotal in guiding and supporting them through their journey. It's essential to foster open communication and be responsive. Recognize that initiating conversations with a high school student can sometimes feel daunting and lead to moments of awkwardness. However, rest assured that with the following tips, you can navigate these initial interactions with confidence and ease.

VISIT TO PURDUE



Event: Visit to Purdue

Date: Oct. XX from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. **Drop-off/Pick-up:** Indiana CPA Society

Suggested Attire: Business Casual

The Visit to Purdue is always a Scholar favorite. This is an exciting opportunity for you to guide and support your Scholar as they explore the world of accounting and higher education. During this event, Scholars will visit Purdue University and engage with the Business Opportunity Program (BOP) students and faculty.

They'll have the chance to connect with college accounting students, accounting faculty, and admissions officers. The day includes a campus tour, participation in an lecture, and lunch on campus. Your role as a mentor is crucial in helping them navigate this campus experience.

Discussion Guide:



Anticipation: Talk to your Scholar about their expectations and excitement for the visit to Purdue. Encourage them to ask questions about college life, accounting programs, and campus activities. Talk about your college experiences!

Networking: Emphasize the value of networking and making connections during their visit. Discuss the benefits of interacting with college accounting students, faculty, and admissions officers.

Campus Exploration: Discuss the significance of the campus tour. Encourage them to take note of key facilities and resources that could aid their academic journey.

Classroom Experience: Help them prepare for sitting in a lecture. Discuss the importance of active listening and engaging in the discussion.

Lunch and Informal Chats: Highlight the opportunities that casual interactions during lunch can offer. Encourage them to strike up conversations with their peers, as well as college students, to gain insights into university life.



COLLEGE NIGHT



Event: College Night

Date: Nov. XX from 6-8:30 p.m.

Drop-off/Pick-up: Indiana CPA Society **Suggested Attire:** School Clothes

College Night is a unique opportunity for you to help your Scholar and their family as they explore the transition to college and (hopefully) the exciting world of accounting.

During this event, Scholars and their families will hear from representatives from financial aid, admissions, accounting faculty, and current accounting students. The goal is to provide valuable insights into the college journey and answer any questions they may have.

Discussion Guide:



Family Participation: Encourage your Scholar to invite their family to attend College Night. Scholars and parents will be in groups and have the opportunity to ask questions to each expert in a small group environment.

Engagement: Discuss the importance of thinking about questions in advance and coming to the event with their list of questions for each expert.

Financial Planning: Emphasize the significance of the financial aid session. Urge them to inquire about scholarships, grants, and financial planning strategies to ensure a smooth transition to college.

Admissions Insights: Discuss the value of hearing from admissions representatives. Encourage them to learn about application processes, deadlines, and requirements to maximize their chances of acceptance.

Faculty Interactions: Highlight the opportunity to connect with accounting faculty members. Brainstorm a few questions they could ask the accounting faculty (examples: questions about the curriculum, resources, and faculty support available to accounting students).

OFFICE VISIT #1



Event: Office Visit #1

Date: Feb. XX from 8 a.m.-4 p.m.

Drop-off/Pick-up: Indiana CPA Society **Suggested Attire:** Business Casual

It's time to gear up for an exciting day of exploration at our first Office Visit experience. This unique event is a stepping stone for Scholars to experience the CPA profession first hand. They'll spend the day at businesses that employ CPAs, where they'll have the chance to meet with CPAs holding various positions and levels within the organization.

This is a fantastic opportunity for them to gain insights, ask questions, and expand their horizons. Since this is their first office visit, let's ensure they're well-prepared for this enriching experience.

Discussion Guide:



Professional Attire: Discuss the importance of dressing appropriately for a business environment. Remind your Scholar that they should dress in business casual attire. This is a great time to talk about do's and don'ts of professional dress.

Engagement and Respect: Highlight the significance of being engaged and respectful during their interactions. Encourage them to actively listen, ask thoughtful questions, and show appreciation for the CPAs' time.

Research: Encourage them to research the organizations we are visiting. Discuss how having a basic understanding about the organization and their business can help them make the most of their visit.

Networking Skills: Share tips on effective networking. Discuss the value of exchanging contact information and actually following-up with the people they meet.

Asking Questions: Discuss the importance of asking questions. Encourage them to inquire about the CPAs' roles, responsibilities, and their journey in the accounting profession.



VISIT TO IU



Event: Visit to IU

Date: March XX from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. **Drop-off/Pick-up:** Indiana CPA Society **Suggested Attire:** School Clothes

Our second campus tour is at the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University. This event is a prime opportunity for Scholars to tour another university. The goal of INCPAS Scholars campus tours is not to pressure them to attend our host university, it's to help them envision themselves in (any) college experience.

After gathering at INCPAS, Scholars will make their way to Bloomington. There, they'll connect with college accounting students and engage with accounting faculty. They'll also have the chance to meet former INCPAS Scholars who attend IU.

Discussion Guide:



Anticipation: Talk to your Scholar about their expectations and excitement for the visit to IU. Use this opportunity to help your Scholar come up with a list of questions they'll want to ask while they're on campus. Remember, even though they've already been on a campus tour, they should come prepared with questions.

Networking: Emphasize the value of networking and making connections during their visit. Discuss the benefits of interacting with college accounting students, faculty, and admissions officers.

Campus Exploration: Discuss the significance of the campus tour. Encourage them to take note of key facilities and resources that could aid their academic journey.

Classroom Experience: Help them prepare for sitting in a lecture. Discuss the importance of active listening and engaging in the discussion.
